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01 Why Join WGC2025

Top gathering event of the global gas community

The World Gas Conference is the global gas industry's pre-eminent event, gathering the global gas community every three years, at a comprehensive conference and trade exhibition. It is the most important flagship event owned by the International Gas Union (IGU), an international institution representing over 90% of the global natural gas production and consumption market.

The first edition of the World Gas Conference (WGC) was held in London, United Kingdom, in 1931. Up to date, 28 editions have been held. The 29th World Gas Conference (WGC2025) is the first of these to visit China. It will take place from 19-23 May 2025, in Beijing.

Under the Presidency of Madam Li Yalan, the IGU is steering a three-year programme committed to "Maximising Gas Benefits" on behalf of the industry through its global advocacy. The culmination of this agenda will be presented at WGC2025 under the theme "Energising a Sustainable Future".

Unprecedented Scale, Breaking Historic Records

This Conference is expected to attract over 30,000 participants from more than 70 countries and regions, covering the entire natural gas value chain. It is anticipated that over 360 exhibitors will gather at WGC2025.



Engage with new and established markets at WGC2025

Each World Gas Conference builds on the legacies built by prior events. Most recently the United States (2018) and Republic of Korea (2022) hosted WGC. While each was globally focused, they were unique in incorporating the culture and industry networks of the host country.


The 2025 edition of the Conference will follow this tradition. WGC2025 introduces exhibitors and sponsors to new markets and networking opportunities within China's sphere of engagement and geography.

China is investing in global energy development through its Belt and Road Initiative addressing energy poverty and opening development opportunities in emerging markets which have been under-represented at other global conferences.


China and its neighbours (Korea and Japan) are the leading LNG import destinations and central to the gas supply chain with their shipbuilding and engineering construction expertise.

China is also home to a vibrant manufacturing industry and a leading player in complementary renewable energy infrastructure development.

02 Who Will You Meet at WGC2025



It is estimated that over 3,500 delegates; senior technical, commercial, strategic executives will participate in WGC2025. The Conference programme is designed to cover the entire gas value chain to attract broader involvement.

WGC2025 will be a grand gathering of the most influential leaders and policy-makers from around the world. Ministers, CEOs and association leaders will unite under one roof to discuss the latest trends and current hot topics.

With the active participation of the industry leaders and senior executives, there will be a sharing of knowledge and insights to achieve a joint vision.



WGC2025 is expected to bring together over 360 global gas and energy exhibitors; covering integrated energy and energy service companies, and almost all of the top 50 oil and gas players.

Engage and network with other industry peers to explore collaboration on vast business opportunities.



Covering a gross exhibition area of 50,000 square metres, WGC2025 will attract engineers, purchase, executives, corporate executives, among others, across the value chain.



03 Past Conferences

As the world's oldest international energy industry event since 1931, when the first World Gas Conference was held in London, governments of host countries have attached great importance to WGCs with several editions witnessing the attendance of head of states and ministerial-and-above-level government officials. Throughout history, WGC has been hosted in 23 cities across 15 countries, including France, UK and the US that have hosted the event more than once.





Space of different types of booth in WGC2022




04 Venue

Venue Introduction

WGC2025 has appointed Beijing Capital Group Exhibitions & Events (BCGEE) as the exclusive PCEO for the event, which will be held from 19-23 May 2025, at the China National Convention Center (CNCC II).

CNCC II is located at the central area of Beijing Olympics and designed by Mr. Christian de Portzamparc, a world-renowned French architect and Pritzker Prize winner. The building takes on a stretched while grand structural shape of "Spreading the Wings" with concise, variable facades, presenting both elegance and geniality in its overall solemnness. CNCC II, still under construction in 2022, was also listed as the top 10 most anticipated venues in the world in 2022. Once completed at the end of 2024, as the final project in the Olympic central area, CNCC-II will be a perfect ending stroke on the central axis of Beijing, which is the epitome of China's cultural confidence, openness, and inclusiveness. The century-old premier event of the gas industry will be held here, adding to the vibrance of the region.





Apart from the welcome and social receptions, the rooftop garden at Phase II can be used as an immersive networking space with Chinese, Western, or gas-themed decorations, providing an enhanced networking experience for attendees.

Phase II features a rooftop garden on the third floor, covering an area of 8,000 square metres. This rooftop garden also has a retractable roof, allowing for an "al fresco" experience.





The second floor of Phase II has a total of 16 medium-sized meeting rooms with an area of over 400 square metres. There are also 23 smaller-sized meeting rooms ranging from 100 to 210 square metres, as well as 10 VIP rooms.


Exhibition Layout



09 Beijing

Introduction

Beijing is a city with a long history and rich culture. It offers a blend of tradition and modernity, featuring numerous tourist attractions and a dazzling array of cuisines. Visitors can experience China's traditional culture and modern ambiance while enjoying a delightful journey.





Transportation Options



International Transportation

Beijing Capital International Airport (BCIA)

BCIA is one of the three comprehensive transportation gateways in China, with a total construction area of 1.41 million square metres. As of October 2023, BCIA has offered routes to 208 destinations in 47 countries and regions. BCIA is about 26 kilometres from CNCC, with just a 30-minute drive.

Beijing Daxing International Airport (BDIC)

As of December 2023. Daxing Airport has offered more than 30 international/Hong Kong/Macao/Taiwan routes, with a 72-kilometre distance and a 75-minute drive from CNCC.



Inter-city Transportation

With seven railway stations, Beijing is China's largest railway hub. A vast network of railway lines covers across China. Online ticketing services are available.



Beijing City Transportation

Subway

Beijing's subway system has 27 lines as of December 2023; by 2025, there will be 30 lines. Self-service ticketing machines support QR code payment. CNCC sits next to the Olympic Park Station on Beijing Subway Lines 8 and 15.



Taxi


There are 279 taxi companies in Beijing, operating about 70,000 taxis. The initial fee of a taxi is RMB 13 for the first three kilometres, and it costs RMB 2.3 for each additional kilometre after that. Each ride incurs a fuel fee of RMB 1.



There are more than 20,000 buses that operate on more than 1,000 routes in Beijing, undertaking the task of ground public transportation in Beijing.

Beijing has been completely covered by shared bike operations. Rent-and-return services are available across the six central urban districts. Bike sharing is an eco-friendly, practical, and efficient way of transportation. Bikes can be used simply by scanning a QR code.
