Positioning Youth in the Nerve of Political Agenda of Water: From Ideas to Actions

Youths have played a significant role in implementing sustainable integrated water resources management (IWRM). They translate ideas into initiatives and actions, which are beneficial for achieving IWRM. Different individual to collective activities and processes are performed to actualize them, starting at local and international levels. However, youth still need to be fully engaged at the global forum for reasons such as lack of political experience, knowledge, skill, support, and platform facilitating their political engagement, lack of opportunities to be involved, and other factors.

There are many political water areas where youth can be engaged in the processes nowadays. For example, the UN-Water Conference, World Water Forum, World Water Congress, Asia-Pacific Water Forum, Asia International Water Week, and so forth are the water events that have mainstreamed youth in their event lifecycle processes. However, these events must permanently integrate youth agendas into their processes without separating them exclusively.

This session will discuss how young people are engaged at the political table without discriminating and accommodating their voices as a part of the political water agenda. This session will be organized by the Indonesian Green Action Forum (IGAF) in collaboration with the Asia Water Council (AWC), Asia-Water Council Young Professionals (AWCYP), and UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration.
